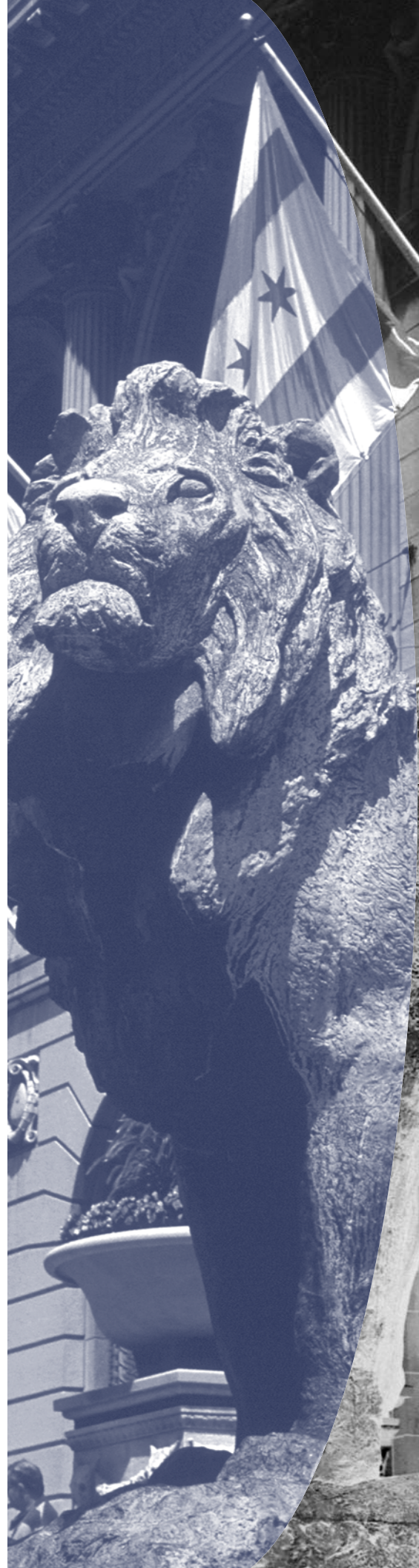

The Federation requires that audiences as FASEB-sponsored educational programs be informed of a presenter's (speaker, faculty, author, or contributor) academic and professional affiliation, and the existence of any significant financial interest or other relationship a presenter has with the manufacturer(s) of any commercial product(s) discussed in an education presentation. When an unlabeled use of a commercial product or an investigational use not yet approved for any purpose is discussed during the presentation, it is required that presenters disclose that the product is not labeled for the use under discussion or that the product is still investigational. This policy allows the listener/attended to be fully knowledgeable in evaluating the information being presented.

Disclosure includes any relationship that may bias one's presentation or which, if known, could give the perception of bias. These situations may include, but are not limited to:

- A. Stock options or bond holdings in a for-profit corporation or self-directed pension plan
- B. Research grants
- C. Employment (full- or part-time)
- D. Ownership or partnership
- E. Consulting fees or other remuneration
- F. Non-remunerative positions of influence such as officer, board member, trustee, spokesperson
- G. Receipt of royalties
- H. Speakers bureau
- I. Other

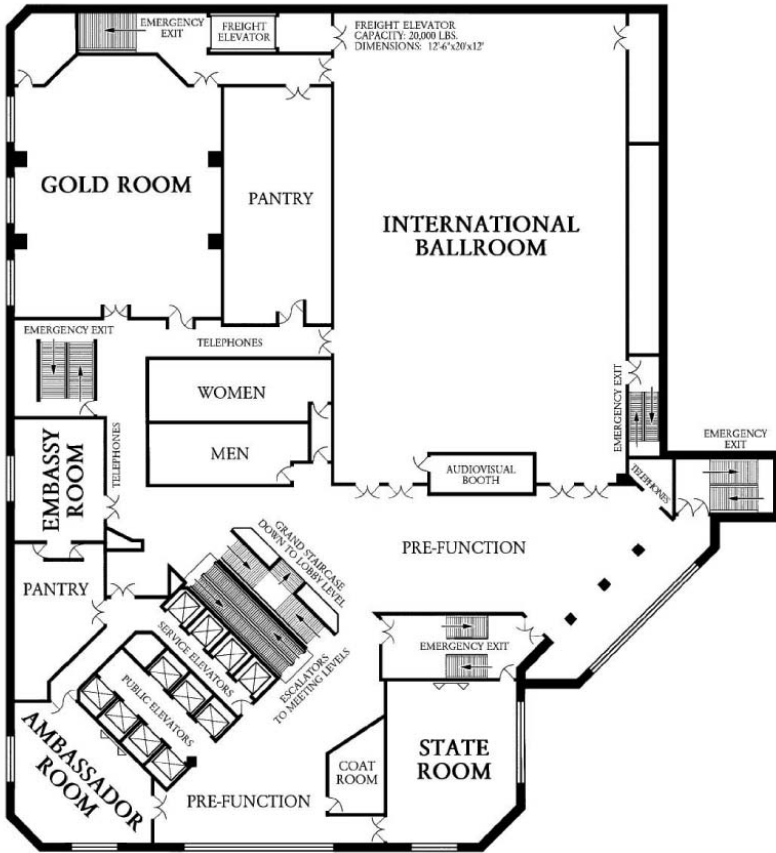

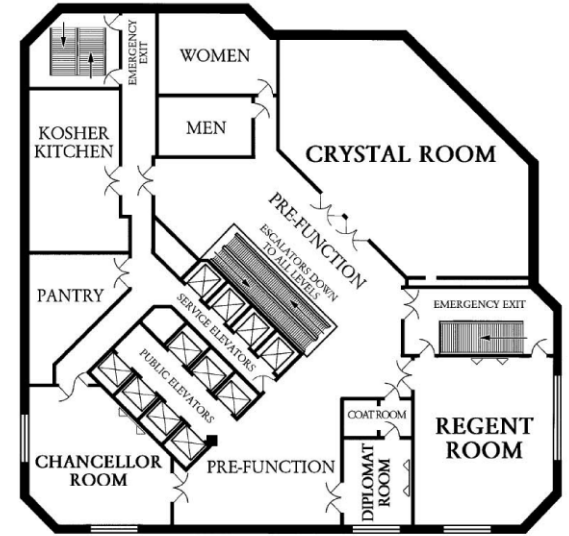

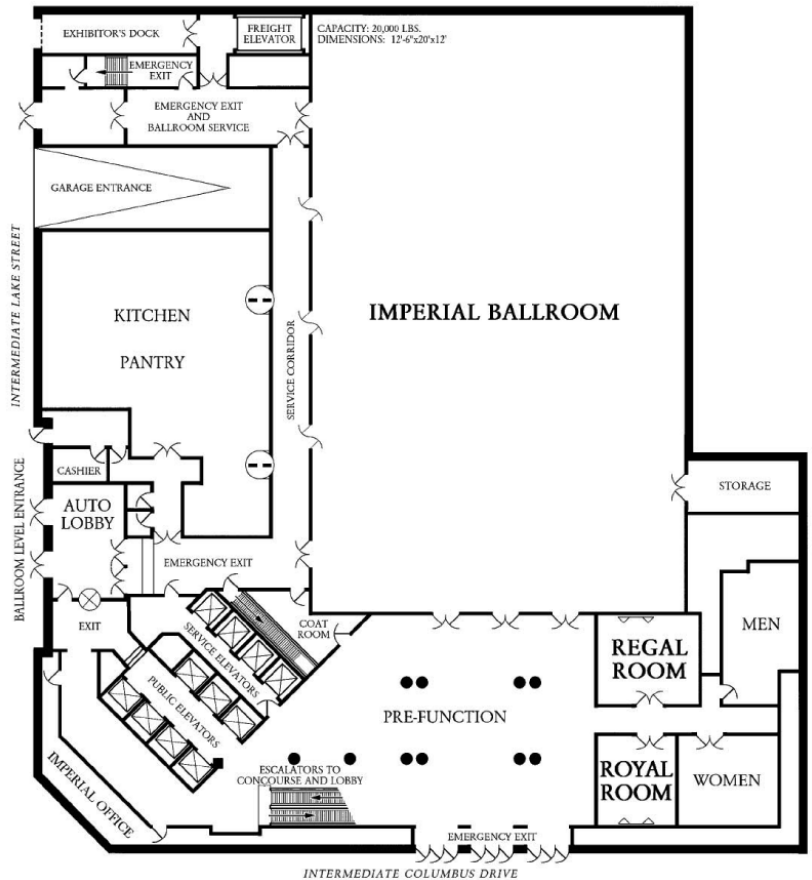
International Ballroom Level (2nd level)



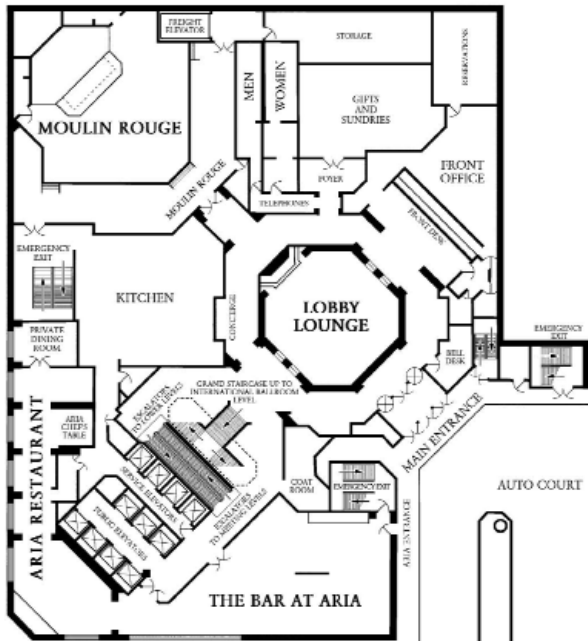
Meeting Room Level (3rd level)
