Since then, APSA, a trainee-based organization and a fully volunteer organization, has continued to increase and integrate the contributions of physician-scientist trainees to the Joint Meeting.

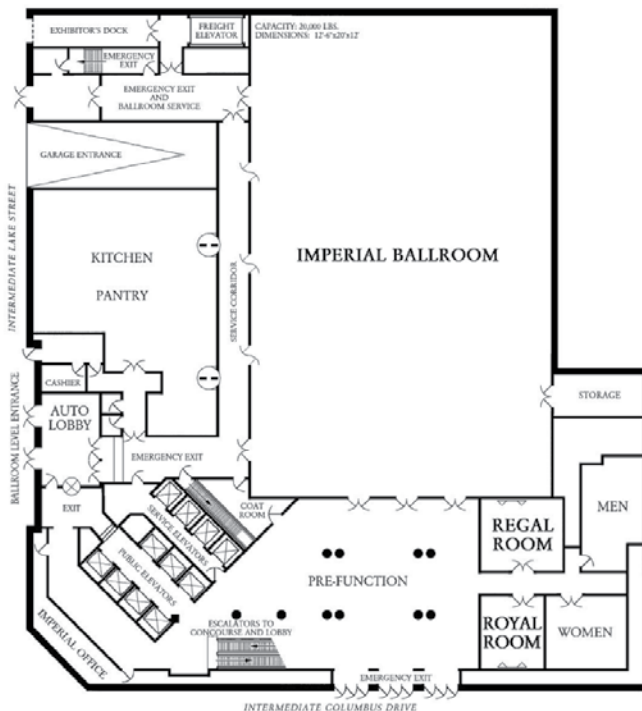
